Although we do not expect to introduce any bills this session, we do expect that legislation will be introduced regarding the Alternative Learning Programs. Due to the unfavorable audits of these programs, some have called for legislation. CHN representatives have made many trips to Olympia to meet with lawmakers and key individuals, and to testify at hearings, we hope this will have an influence on future legislation. Our goal is to make sure that any legislation regarding these programs includes proper language in it to protect independent homeschooling and future homeschool freedoms.
